Purpose of this code of conduct

- allow others to express themselves and understand that all views are important even
 if they are not the same as their own as long as no offence is caused even if
 unintentionally
- speak to the Volunteer leader in the first instance if they have any issues with the work or the other volunteers.

Equal Opportunities

A volunteer must:-

- Understand, respect and work at all times without prejudice to race, age, ethnic
 origins, disability, gender, physical and mental health, religion, sexuality or cultural
 background.
- Understand that all forms of discrimination, including bullying and harassment are unacceptable and contravene the Council's Diversity and Equality Policy.
- Perform his/her duties with honesty, integrity, impartiality, objectivity and a positive attitude

Volunteers should:-

- Work together and help each other wherever possible
- Listen to and adhere to the volunteer leaders instructions
- Ask the volunteer leader if in doubt about any of the instructions as many times as is needed.
